LOCAL ANESTHESIA



Local anesthesia is usually administered through an injection, which numbs the surrounding area within a few minutes. This numbing effect allows your dentist to perform procedures while you remain awake but do not feel any pain.

ORAL SEDATION



Oral sedation is given in pill form and taken by mouth. The medication typically makes you feel drowsy and reduces anxiety. While this type of sedation keeps you awake during the procedure, you may not remember much of it, depending on the dosage.

LAUGHING GAS



Nitrous Oxide, commonly known as laughing gas, is the most widely used sedative in dental practices due to its easy administration, effectiveness, and quick recovery time. While it won't put you to sleep, it will help you feel relaxed, allowing you to stay alert and respond to your dentist during the procedure.
